

After the Money and Society MOOC, Get Qualified with 4 days in London.

Money and Society MOOC Participants can become qualified by joining a 4 day course in London on March 18-21. If you sign up, you will meet the tutors of the MOOC (Jem, Leander and Matthew) and experience a highly interactive 4 days with much time outside the classroom. There is a day at the Tomorrow's Transactions conference on financial technologies, featuring well known figures in crypto-currencies, a guided critical tour of Docklands by Occupy Tours, guest lectures by Benita Matofska of The People Who Share, Tom Shakhli of the Brixton Pound and Matthew McStravick of the Economy of Hours. There's also a guided tour of the Docklands Museum to explore more historical context for current innovations and campaigns. Having done the MOOC you will already be a 3rd of the way to completing an official qualification in this field. It is also a great opportunity to meet leading practitioners in currency innovation, to help you with your own present or future initiative.
